**Katherine O. Arthur** – Auditor General recommendation we follow this procedure so we can use the funds correctly. Funds will be used for preparation for cold Winter Season.

**Stanley Teller** – I agree with the resolution. People need assistance in the remote area, Coal has been closed.

**Marlen Thomas** – We have 71, 230,97 how much of that will be used.

**Katherine O. Arthur** – Not all will be used we will only use enough to prepare. I can not tell you an amount, We bought wood, food and coal last year. We go on the list from CHR, Chapter and Senior Citizens list were not using all of it.

**Roland Tso**- Be aware even though approved. Not everyone will be assisted. CHR provides a list of her high risk clients. Once people hear of this the staff and myself get harassed. Men and Women who are at high risk will be assisted. We have seen people who have are in dire need of help, people who have children not checking on them. Last year on a Saturday we delivered food with the staff.

**Dave Nez**- Emergency Funding preparedness is what we are discussing is there a policy? Emergency Response and Emergency Recovery how do we correct the problems?

**Roland Tso** – Emergency Plan we have and we are prepared we work with neighboring community Wherever we see that it needs to be revised. Lately the chapter has been the shelter. Officials and Staff volunteer.

**Perry Slivers**- Its always said the people that live out some people that live near the roads do not have vehicles, some of the Veterans do not have a vehicle. Funds are available by vote everyone should be treated the same.

**Katherine O. Arthur**- We do fall short. I look to the CHR, staff, myself. Give us a list of the Veterans we do meet. We do meet on the list and we meet daily. Someone is always here.

**Jacqueline Begaye**- We did assist several Veterans last year. Roland and Irvin delivered food, water, wood and coal to them.

**Marlene Thomas** – Perry is correct. We receive the funds according to the voters. Our people do not learn. We should be hauling wood during the summer. We only look to the chapter. We did not get a report from last year on who got assisted it is public information. When I was chapter official we served many people. I have a question will hay be available?

**Roland Tso**- Be aware people are main priority. Funds assessment needs to be done. The funds are available for emergency such as when a semi caught on fire and destroyed the road, the people in the surrounding area had to be evacuated, it was a good thing they had family members to stay the night at. We assisted people with hotel room for a week when a student broke a thermometer and contaminated the whole house. We found out that when we gave hay, people turn around and sell it. We witnessed it.

There are a lot of people who are not GA and Food Stamp offices you can register to vote. Post Office and Drivers License are available to register to vote. If your grandparents are not registered help them get registered. If they do not have an ID help them get one. They do enjoy voting and they do not miss it. We do voting register for students at Many Farms, Chinle, Rough Rock and other places. Have your children learn their Census Number and Social Security Number many young people don't know this. Early voting is will be available at the place I work. You can vote Monday through Thursday, Eight to Five on Fridays it will be in Tees Nos Pos.

Billy Begay- What about the impeachment will it cause a disruption.

Larry Nobel – Impeachment has nothing to do with the election process. You can only vote once.

Thank you for allowing him to do his report. Thank him also for providing us information.

Katherine O. Arthur – We use to meet at 1:00pm now we changed it to 10:00am. Mr Handley your resolution passed we asked about the

**B. Boys' & Girls Club/IEC – Algerino Tsedah, Project Manager**

**Algerino Tsedah**- Boys and Girls Club of American and Navajo Nation have an agreement now for three years ago. We have a compliance and building, instrument. We have had complaints of sexual abuse of various forms. It is not here, but elsewhere. Due to this there was one million insurance but that changed to three million. We had a lengthy discussion on this in Orlando Florida. The temporary insurance will expire on December 21. We have an enrollment of 130 for three months before we went over 150 we are asking why we also discussed this. We will be contacting parents. Reasons we came to was that parents that work left the community with their kids. The weather is colder and we also are under construction, floor tiles and addition. Insulation has been installed. We have an electrification on site now. Once completed we will do an enrollment drive. I don't like to use recruit. We want to bring in more teens. We have ideas to bring in the teens. Average Daily Attendance is at 13. We only have two staff, myself and one other lady. My goal is to have full staff by January. We help with homework and teach about language and family. I appreciate the officials for their support. We are looking to Mr. Handley and the school to work with us in obtaining a building that is in the future. On the Wellness Center 2008 we had it established. We are working with P and Z. We are going through the protocol. We want to reestablish the wellness center our goal to have it open in January. Implement a five hundred mile challenge you will receive a pair of shoes it is allowable under unhealthy sales tax. We will schedule walks. On Thanksgiving at 8:00am we will do a color walk. T-shirts will be provided. We would like to start a support group for the people who are standing at the stores. I was glad we had farmers meeting it made me feel emotional. We have a wellness committee. We will meet November 19 2019, We need teens and older people. I do email to teachers but I have not received a response. I am also on IEC, resolution was passed. I have not been informed of a meeting.

**D. Many Farms Public School/CUSD # 24 – Vernita Largo, Parent Liaison**

**Vernita Largo** – Reviewed attached data of staff and enrollment.

**Roland Tso**- Thank you for the report. We have a concern. There is only one security. We say there is a concern for the safety. Better monitoring needs to be done on the check out. We tested this seven times and our child was released to someone other than the person listed. We even witnessed a person unauthorized to take a student off the bus. We have not even seen the principal, that is why I requested to have him here.

**Aljerino Tsedah** –left meeting at 2:08pm

**Vernita Largo** - December they will be checking ID. Attendance monitor told me this. I am in the process of learning things, Asking for ID it will be guarantee it will happen.

**Jacqueline Begaye**- My Concern is the area where kids get dropped off better monitoring needs to happen people park there vehicle there and hold up traffic. People pass other vehicles without consideration for the students getting off. Due to time change it gets darker sooner and after school activity busdrivers need to practice waiting a bit longer for the students to safely get away from the bus and educate students to go home quickly not take their time.

**Vernita Largo**- Thank you for your concern and comments I will work with the school and relay the concerns..

**Katherine O. Arthur** – Thank you for the information

**E. Planning & Zoning Commission – Roland Tso**

**Katherine O. Arthur** –October 18 we had a meeting with OEH Sanitation Department we meant and asked about Chapter House to be renovated we asked about asbestos maybe in the building as well as to have the wellness center to be checked, he said that is not his job, it was Risk Management Navajo Nation he said he will be here when they come. Solid Waste was discussed we have a committee and St Michael has not gave an answer. Trash Bin we have free of charge. We have the holidays coming up we will be getting more trash. It fills up quickly. Please, please follow the rules. If it continues to not be followed we will not offer it any more. Renovation will happen once Risk Management clears us, We asked DDI on the feasibility study. DDI is using grant money to do the study. Business class were done this summer, we had people come in that were photographers, artist, and people who work with animals. This a short report

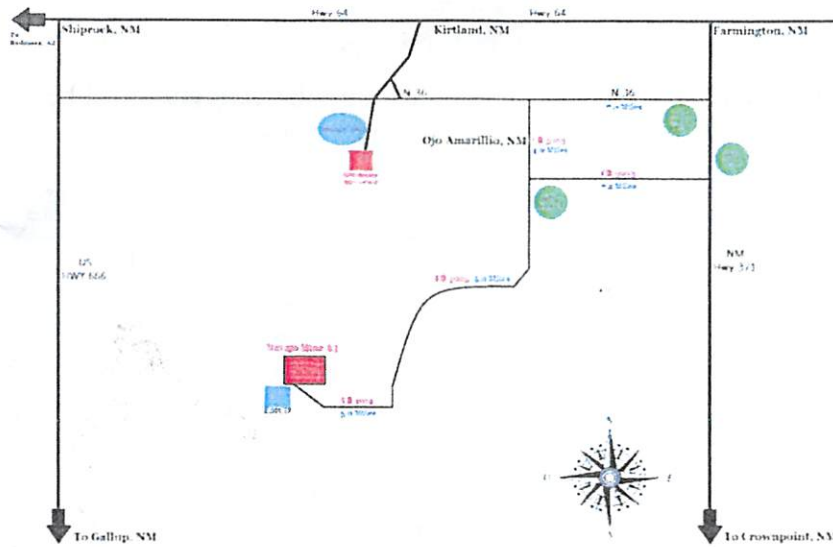

## Directions to Navajo Mine Community Coal Yard

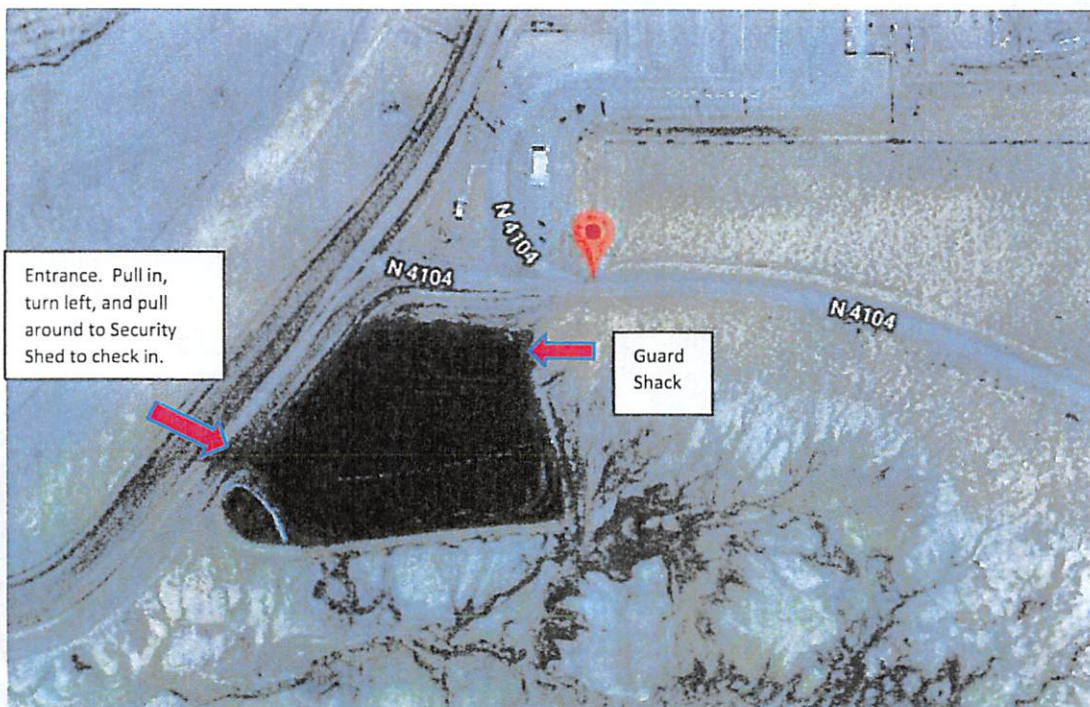
